SUMMER SIGHT WORD PRACTICE

Students, practice reading these words every week. Choose a day in June to quiz yourself. With an adult's help, highlight the all the words you read correctly in **yellow** crayon or colored pencil. Choose a day in July to quiz yourself again, and color any new words that you can read **light blue**. Finally, choose a day in August to quiz yourself and color any new words that you can read **green**. See how many you learn each month!

Parents: You and your child are receiving two lists. The words found on the *First Grade List* are expected to be mastered by the end of first grade. Those found on the *Second Grade List* will be encountered often by your child in the upcoming year. Daily practice will help to fill in any gaps from last year and also help to prepare students for the second grade reading program. Please help your children to read these words throughout the summer and to use the color code from above. It is best to choose dates toward the end of the month to allow time for learning. Note the date of each quiz in the space provided. This sheet will need to be returned the first week of school along with the colored word sheets.
